CONTINUING THE PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY IN OUR PUBLIC PROTECTION MANDATE

The Council of the College of Dental Technologists of Ontario approved a Towards Transformation Action Plan (the “Plan”) in 2015 to ensure that the College continues to meet its mandate in the years ahead, is able to improve transparency and achieve greater engagement with Members, the public and stakeholders. Twenty-three initiatives were set out in this Plan and seventeen of these have been completed or seen significant progress. This accomplishment has moved the College forward significantly in the areas of governance, operations, communications, ensuring quality practice and program delivery.

What is our Council doing to continue the pursuit of excellence and accountability?

Over the next few months, the College is embarking on strategic planning, one of the significant initiatives laid out in the Plan. The College will use this process to identify its future direction, priorities and goals for the next three to five years. Members of the College, professional associations, other health profession regulators, key decision makers in the Ontario government, and leaders within Ontario's healthcare system will be able to provide their feedback on their expectations of the College through surveys, face to face interviews and focus groups.

A solidified strategic plan will allow the College to fulfil not only its public protection mandate but to stand out amongst other regulators as a model for effective governance.
