Canadian Alliance of Dental Technology Regulators (CADTR) was recently awarded funding from the Government of Canada Foreign Credential Recognition Program in support of the “Access to Dental Technology Project”. The overriding purpose of the project is to create efficient standardized and harmonized credential assessment and licensure processes for Internationally Educated Dental Professionals (IEDP) leading to improved labour market integration. The likely benefits are to ensure that there is an adequate number of qualified and competent internationally and Canadian-educated registered dental technologists/technicians to practice this respected profession across Canada.

We are currently conducting a review of the [Competency Profile for Canadian Dental Technicians/Technologists](#), 2011 (Competency Profile), which defines the required knowledge, skill and judgement of dental technologists/technicians. It is the backbone of Entry-to-Practice Assessment; Standards of Practice; Quality Assurance; Professional Conduct; and communicates to the public the profession’s role and required competence.
