

Guidelines for Registered Dental Technologists

COVID-19

The College's <u>Standard of Practice: Infection Prevention & Control, (September 22, 2017)</u> sets out the expectation of its Members in regards to the prevention of transmission of infectious diseases and procedures for infection prevention/control in the dental technology practice. Infection prevention and control is an important part of the health and safety of both patients and practitioners.

Here's what Dental Technologists need to know:

- 1. All dental technology care settings should follow their usual activities using routine practices as outlined in the <u>CDTO IPAC Standard</u>, including droplet and contact precautions.
- Dental Technologists and their staff should be actively screening (asking questions) and passively screening (using <u>signage</u>) for COVID-19. For more detailed information on screening, please refer to Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) <u>Guidance for Primary Care Providers in a</u> <u>Community Setting</u>.
- 3. Screening is completed to assess the client to determine if they meet the definition of a <u>"Person</u> <u>Under Investigation (PUI)"</u>.
- 4. Screening should be done over the phone before scheduling appointments.
- 5. Where clients present without phone screening, trained staff should screen clients to determine if they meet the definition of a <u>PUI</u>.
- 6. Staff conducting screening should ideally be behind a barrier to protect from droplet/contact spread.
- 7. Signage should be posted asking clients with symptoms to identify themselves.
- 8. All suspected cases MUST be reported to your <u>Local Public Health Unit</u> to determine next steps.
