Open Consultations and Stakeholder Engagement



CDTO partners with members of the public and the profession to share information and educate and to gather information and perspectives that will better inform the College's leadership team and Council's decision making.

Emergency Class of Registration and Proposed Amendments

The College has organized a public consultation on proposed draft regulation amendments to create a emergency class certificate of registration. You can read the draft regulation here and we encourage you to provide any feedback through our short survey.

We have also created a <u>consultation document</u> that compares our proposed regulation with the current one and potential impacts to our stakeholders. We would like thank those who have already participated in our consultation. If you have not had the opportunity to do so we encourage you to have your voice heard by providing your feedback by **April 18, 2023**.

Background

In April 2022 in an effort to bolster Ontario's health workforce and improve health resource planning in emergency situations, the Provincial Government enacted the Pandemic and Emergency Preparedness Act, 2022.

This act requires all of Ontario's health regulators to propose changes to their registration regulations to allow for an emergency class and to focus their proposed changes on four key areas:

- Circumstances that will open the emergency class of registration.
- Requirements for emergency registration.
- How long an emergency certificate of registration is valid.
- Moving from the emergency class to another class of registration.

Since the launch of the Strategic Plan in 2017 the College has identified policy decisions that would set requirements to register safe, competent, and ethical dental technologists, ensure fair registration practices, and reflect modern dental technology practice. The College has drafted amendments to the proposed registration regulation that reflect feedback on new and updated certificates of registration, an alternate pathway to registration, and clear and transparent requirements for registration.

All health regulators must submit proposed changes to their registration regulations that reflect the creation of the emergency class of registration as well as the additional amendments recommended by the College to the Ministry of Health by May 1, 2023 with the goal of having the changes in place by August 31, 2023.

2022 College Performance Measurement Framework Report

The College Performance Measurement Framework (CPMF) is a Ministry of Health initiative to understand how well health regulatory colleges are executing their mandate, which is to act in the public interest. Colleges use a Reporting Tool to assess their performance and submit evidence against standards.


What's New?

In 2022, the Ministry has categorized eight existing pieces of evidence as 'Benchmarked Evidence'. These are attributes of an excellent regulator, and Colleges should meet, or work towards meeting these benchmarks.

CDTO's Performance

Decisions, activities, processes, or the quantifiable results (i.e., required evidence) are used to demonstrate a College's performance against a standard. Colleges also indicate the level at which they have the required evidence by indicating Yes, Partially or No.

There are 50 required pieces of evidence in CPMF across six domains. One domain, System Partners, does not have required evidence and instead Colleges provide examples of initiatives and system partners they engage with to align oversight of the practice of the profession, support execution of its mandate, and respond to changing public expectations.
